- Serve as a reviewer for CCWT competitive programs (e.g., Early Career Scholars) or mentor an applicant for these competitions;
- Present at a CCWT-sponsored event (e.g., webinar, CCWT Fall Conference);
- Develop a grant proposal that includes CCWT staff as co-PIs or senior personnel;
- Co-author a CCWT-relevant publication with CCWT research staff; and/or
- Collaborate with CCWT to serve historically marginalized communities and foster fairness, equity, and inclusion in workforce transition outcomes.
